

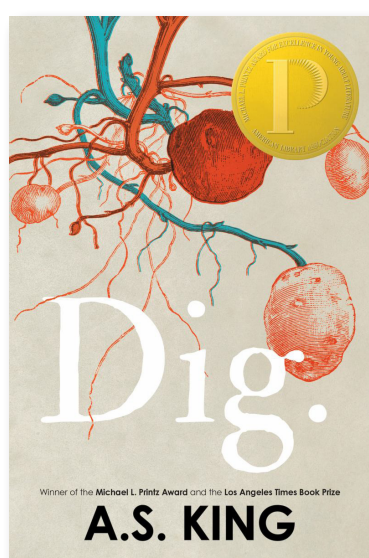

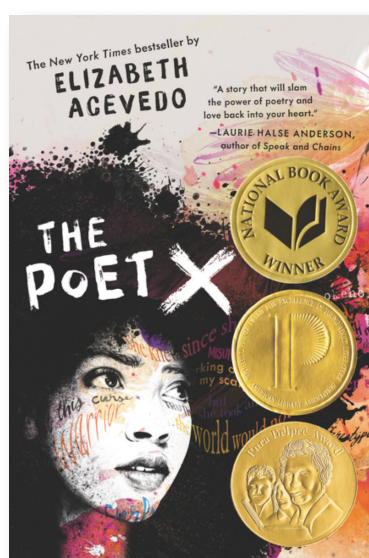
Everything Sad Is Untrue (A True Story)
